1. Introduction

Introductions were provided by each attendee. From the Mississaugas of the New Credit First Nation (MNCFN) Megan DeVries (MD) is an archaeologist and the Field Liaison Representative (FLR) coordinator and Fawn Sault (FS) is the consultation manager. From the City of Brampton, Compton Bobb (CB) is filling in for the City's Project Manager, Bishnu Parajuli. David Sinke (DS) is the Project Manager for the City's consultant, Amec Foster Wheeler. Mary Kelly (MK) is the consultant's consultation lead.

2. Historical Overview

FS provided a background on the Annishinaabe people as well as the MNCFN. In the area, prior to arrival of the French, the area included the Huron, Petum (Tobacco) and Neutral. As the economic stimulus of the fur trade brought the French, it also brought disease that devastated that Annishinaabe people. There is a medicinal plant that is used to treat small pox but it was over harvested and as a result there was a halt placed on its harvest (it is also a plant that cannot be successfully transplanted).

MATTERS DISCUSSED

ACTION BY:

Thee Huron were pushed north and east as the Five Nations (Seneca, Cayuga, Onondaga, Oneida, and Mohawk) took advantage of the disease plagued Huron. The Annishinaabe people waited to see if Five Nations would continue their push north and they did. As a result, the Beaver Wars began through a military alliance of the three fires: Ojibwe, Odawa, and Potawatomi. The three fires is represented on the MNCFN logo. The wars were brutally effective and pushed the Five Nations back across the lake. It is said that there 1000's of canoes in the waterways and Skull Island was named after the visual results of the war.

In 1700, a peace treaty was signed between the Mohawk and the Mississaugas to put an end to the bloodshed. Intermarriages meant that you cannot kill your family.

The Five Nations later (1720) became the Six Nations with the addition of Tuscarora. FS said that around 1746 that it became the Seven Nations with the addition of the Mississaugas but that an Elder identified that it did not happen because the government did not ratify it.

The Huron and Seneca had large villages and stayed in place much longer whereas the Mississaugas 'lived lightly on the land'.

With the American Revolution (1775), the British were losing the fight and with the support of Six Nations and loyalists they won. However, they needed to provide these supporters a place to live. The Haldimand Tract was given to them.

The Mississaugas were living along what is now known as the Credit River. They were known as good business people and took care of each other so that they always stood in good credit (hence the name). However, the influx of settlers imposed on their way of life and they were forced to relocate to the current reserve area. The Six Nations offered the land; they later requested payment for the land.

The Government gave order to cause strife between the Six Nations and the Mississaugas due to the power these Aboriginal groups held. There was a clear discrepancy in the understanding of land – ownership vs. sharing.

3. MNCFN DOCA

In January 2015, the MNCFN formed the Department of Consultation and Accommodation (DOCA) to handle duty to consult requests. Prior to this, there was no structure and handling requests was challenging. Mark LaForme is there director and aside from FS and MD there are five other staff (four of which were recently hired) including an office manager, two administrative assistants, a strategic advisor and specialist in Traditional Knowledge/Land Use.

MNCFN to provide draft agreement (provided April 29, 2016) Meeting Date: April 28, 2016

MATTERS DISCUSSED

ACTION BY:

MNCFN have two new claims:

- 1. March 2016, land claim for the Rouge Valley
- 2. May 2016 (anticipated), claim for the water, lands under the water and floodplains within their Traditional Territory

FS handles the triage of over 100 request a week. As part of this triage process, the MNCFN assesses the information into:

- Low level concern, such as small infrastructure and residential development projects; and
- High level concern, such as pipelines, renewable energy, large infrastructures project, or projects that are likely to impact Aboriginal and treaty rights. These triggers may include work in or near waterways/floodplains/wetlands, Species At Risk, archaeology.
 - Consultation expectations at this level include meetings, capacity funding to review reports, and Impact Benefit Agreements (IBAs) for large or long-term project.

Megan DeVries (MD) identified that the MNCFN's main reason for concern is that the project occurs within their traditional territory and crosses the Credit River, which is the heart of their homeland.

The type of information that MNCFN seeks upfront is any existing environmental (aquatic, terrestrial, plant, ecological, land classification) or archaeological studies. There is also the expectation of participation by FLR. Two monitors are always sent out for safety and security. For archaeological work this includes all Stage 2, 3 and 4 work. The main purpose for the presence of field liaison monitors is to have eyes on the ground (otherwise they are unsure of the field work). The view is that if boots are on the ground then the FLRs should be there. FLRs participate alongside consultant. The proponent is expected to cover the costs of the field monitors (rate, per diem, mileage) but that MNCFN has the necessary insurance and WSIB coverage. The terms and contract provide the details.

MNCFN goal is to sit down with municipalities to build relationships and be part of the process for planning and development projects (such as Official Plans and amendments, Class EAs). Notices are not consultation.

Construction and post monitoring FLR participation is also expected for large projects and/or where concerns are identified.

DS provided an overview of project specifics through review of drawings of the Class EA study area.

MATTERS DISCUSSED

The project covers the last undeveloped area within the municipal boundaries. It will provide transportation connections to the future/proposed Highway 427 extension and GTA West. It is situated in the Humber River Watershed.

The Secondary Plan for Area 47 (SP47) is an amendment to the Official Plan and includes a Transportation Plan. The Class EA will look at road improvements for Clarkway Road, Countryside Drive and Coleraine Road as well as two new aerial roads (A2 and East-West). The current study will confirm and refine the proposed configurations.

There are some wetlands in the area as identified on the land use map. Some in-water work may involve the removal of fish barriers to enhance the environment. DS identified that the team is consulting with the MNRF and GRCA.

FS identified that they would like to be involved in the mitigation enhancement effort.

The human and biophysical studies will proceed once permissions to enter are acquired (likely May or June). The majority of the studies (including archaeological and heritage) will focus on the corridors whereas other (such as stormwater) will focus on the broader area.

The MESP was completed and send for review to the province

MD requested that any existing archaeological and environmental studies be shared.

Good afternoon, Compton!

Thank you for meeting with Fawn and I yesterday morning regarding the Area 47 Class EA project. I am writing to you as a follow-up to that meeting. Please note that it is our policy at MNCFN that all consultation should be carried out directly between the First Nation and the proponent, rather than through a consultant, but given her helpfulness, I have CC'd Mary Kelly of AMEC Foster Wheeler.

I understand that for some proponents this can be unfamiliar territory. Therefore, please allow me to provide you with some background:

Mississaugas of the New Credit First Nation [MNCFN] has formed a new Department of Consultation and Accommodation, in order to respond to rapid and consistent development within its traditional territory. Both the authorities who approve this development and the proponents who drive it have certain consultation responsibilities to the First Nation, as a result of MNCFN's Aboriginal and treaty rights and our continued interests and concerns regarding the land. One of the ways we require proponents to engage with us is in providing transparency during the environmental survey and archaeological assessment process. The best way to accomplish this is by having Field Liaison Representatives on location while fieldwork is occurring, who can ensure that the First Nation's special interests and concerns are respected and considered during the fieldwork. The cultural and natural resources in question are part of MNCFN's traditional territory and heritage, and it is our responsibility to ensure their protection, on behalf of the community.

Therefore, MNCFN insists that its Field Liaison Representatives ("FLRs") are on site whenever any environmental or archaeological fieldwork (Stages 2 through 4) is occurring within our traditional territory. Our preference is that the cost for the participation of our FLRs is covered by the proponent, not the consultant, whom we view as having the ultimate responsibility to consult with the First Nation.

Please also note that MNCFN requires two of its Field Liaison Representatives to be on location whenever fieldwork is taking place within its traditional territory. The reason for this is so that FLRs can provide support and security for each other in the field. This has become a requirement in light of uncommon, but unfortunate, occurrences when FLRs have felt pressured or intimidated from external persons while at work locations. We ask that you would respect this request.

Therefore, please find attached the contract that covers MNCFN's participation in this environmental and archaeological work. The costs associated with this involvement reflect a number of expenses not visible at first glance: payment for the Field Liaison Representatives themselves, operational costs for the department, and efforts to engage the community to garner feedback on these projects. If you could please fill in the additional required information, highlighted in yellow, and return to us a signed copy, that would be greatly appreciated. After we have received it, we can execute the contract on our end and return the completed contract to you. Afterwards, I can arrange scheduling and other fieldwork-related matters directly with AMEC Foster Wheeler, if you prefer.

I would like to acknowledge receipt of your correspondence, which was received on 4/22/2016 regarding the above noted project.

As you may be aware, the area in which your project is proposed is situated within the Traditional Territory of Curve Lake First Nation. Our First Nation's Territory is incorporated within the Williams Treaties Territory and is the subject of a claim under Canada's Specific Claims Policy. We strongly suggest that you provide Karry Sandy-Mackenzie, Williams Treaty First Nation Claims Coordinator, 8 Creswick Court, Barrie, ON L4M 2S7, with a copy of your proposal as your obligation to consult to also extend to the other First Nations of the Williams Treaties.

Although we have not conducted exhaustive research nor have we the resources to do so, Curve Lake First Nation Council is not currently aware of any issues that would cause concern with respect to our Traditional, Aboriginal and Treaty rights.

Please note that we have particular concern for the remains of our ancestors. Should excavation unearth bones, remains or other such evidence of a native burial site or any Archaeological findings, we must be notified without delay. In the case of a burial site, Council reminds you of your obligations under the Cemeteries Act to notify the nearest First Nation Government or other community of Aboriginal people which is willing to act as a representative and whose members have a close cultural affinity to the interred person. As I am sure you are aware, the regulations further state that the representative is needed before the remains and associated artifacts can be removed. Should such a find occur, we request that you contact our First Nation immediately.

Curve Lake First Nation also has available, trained Archaeological Liaisons who are able to actively participate in the archaeological assessment process as a member of a field crew, the cost of which will be borne by the proponent.

As you may recall we met together in late April last year. The meeting notes from that meeting are attached.

Since that time the Study Team has been busy doing a number of related activities.

Technical Studies (Field work completed where permission to enter was available – this work was complete prior to our April meeting):

- Structural assessment of culverts and bridges
- Geomorphological assessment at existing and proposed crossing locations
- Cultural, heritage and Stage 1 Archaeological assessments
- Natural sciences studies (terrestrial, avian and aquatic studies)

Other Work:

- Started traffic modeling exercises
- Development of alternative corridor alignments within the special policy areas
- Meetings with stakeholders (such as agencies, businesses, landowners, residents)

Some of the upcoming work that is planned includes:

- Finalize traffic modelling
- Complete remaining field investigations
- Complete detailed evaluation of alternative alignments
- Prepare conceptual designs for five arterial roadways

As you can see from the list above there is outstanding field work to be conducted, which is pending permission to enter; once received, our team will be in contact with schedule and activity list.

During this Study, there is no planned Stage 2 archaeological work. The Stage 2 will be completed after the preferred alternatives (their general layout) has been determined but prior to any detailed design work.

If you have any comments or questions about the proposed alignments we would be happy to discuss. As well, the City would be open to meeting to discuss the preferred alternatives prior to finalizing them.

Preliminary Recommendations for Potentially Impacted Properties

- Heritage documentation prior to road improvements
- Construction fencing and tree hoarding adjacent to heritage resource

Transportation Safety


- Steep roadside slopes will be replaced with flat boulevards beyond the clear zone and the roads will have curb and gutter
- Proposed cross sections are wide enough that hydro poles will be located far from the road
- Multi-use pathways will be located on both sides of Countryside Drive, Clarkway Drive and East-West Arterial. Bus bays will be at all major intersections
- AODA-compliant traffic signals will be installed at all signalized intersections
- Proposed horizontal and vertical alignment meet/exceeds geometric design standards for enhanced safety



Traffic Operations

- Without the proposed improvements, drivers will experience significant travel delays throughout the network within the next 10 years
- Improvements include:
 - Construction of a new 4-lane arterial roadway (East-West Arterial)
 - Widen existing Countryside Drive to 4-lanes
- Widen existing Clarkway Drive to 4-lanes
- Traffic signals at all major intersections




Signalized Intersections Level of Service - 2041 AM Peak

Integration with Master Environmental Servicing Plan (MESP) & Addendum

- The MESP guides development for secondary plan area
- MESP Identified environmental features and constraints for what cannot be impacted and how the impacts will be compensated
- MESP Addendum Rainbow Creek: To increase developable land, Rainbow Creek is being realigned and the floodplain is being narrowed. In exchange for loss of floodplain, the natural corridor along the creek will be significantly improved
- Bridges over Rainbow Creek have been designed for its future, improved condition. Includes providing higher and wider openings to allow for more light and animal movement under the bridges.





Completed Technical Studies





Fluvial Geomorphology

- Field Observations Watercourse crossings in the study area predominantly consist of channels that have been highly impacted by agricultural land practices
- Recommendation All watercourses require channel realignment as a result of the road widening/construction works, and that these channels accommodate a minimum span of the largest meander amplitude within the vicinity of the crossing
- The replacement and redesign of the new crossing structures will help reduce channel instability and they will stabilize these watercourse crossings







Contamination Overview Study

- The study identified properties on or near the road that may be sources of soil and groundwater contamination and may affect construction
- 36 properties were identified as having a high potential, 10 parcels had medium potential for environmental contamination. 13 significant spill locations were identified
- Recommendations Soil and ground water sampling recommended for areas within the footprint of the future road to assess site conditions for soil and groundwater quality











Ongoing / Completed Technical Studies





Natural Environment - Terrestrial

- 8 Reptiles, 11 amphibians, 36 species of birds, and 42 species of mammals were identified
- There were 3 Species at Risk in the area: Bobolink, Barn Swallow, Caspian Tern
- Minimal removal of natural materials, stabilize and re-vegetation all areas of disturbed/exposed soil
- Terrestrial enhancement opportunities Placing vegetation at culvert inlets and outlets
 which encourage wildlife crossing and remove
 crossing barriers such as culvert grading, log
 jams or fencing
- Any proposed work activities in migratory bird habitat is recommended to be undertaken outside of the active breeding season (April 1 to August 31)

Natural Environment - Aquatic

- The tributaries have unstable flow regimes with limited canopy cover, making the tributaries unstable habitats for specialized feeders and fish-eating fish in the area
- Preliminary Mitigation Measures design and install culverts to prevent barriers to fish movement, design and implement standard Erosion and Sediment Control, avoid impact to the watercourse, minimize removals of natural areas and restore to pre-construction state or better
- Aquatic enhancement opportunities: Plant shrubs along the channel banks, enhance watercourse buffers through the riparian restoration and revegetation and protect natural areas



Stormwater Management

- No storm sewers or formal stormwater management are currently present.
- Proposed conditions Urbanized right-ofway with multiple travel lanes and multi-use paths, storm sewer system draining to a formal stormwater management infrastructure, and Low Impact Development features within right-of-way limits
- The Stormwater Management Report is ongoing and currently awaiting information from the Toronto and Region Conservation Authority

- Foundational investigations for bridges and culverts (structures & retaining walls)
- Slope stability analysis for embankments
- Preliminary soil chemical analysis

Hydrogeological Investigations

- Identification of potential water bearing formations that may be impacted
- Impacts to groundwater

Noise Studies

- The results of the noise study indicate the need for noise barriers along certain locations




PART A DESIGN – REGION OF PEEL ROADWAYS Arterial A2 Coleraine Drive

Arterial A2

- Ultimate six lane cross-section from Regional Road 50 to Mayfield Road within a 45 m right-of-way
- 3.0 m wide multi-use pathways along entire length of both sides of the road
- Provisions for transit bays, pad, and shelters at all intersections
- Left and right turn lanes at all intersections
- Set along the west side of the dividing line between blocks to minimize property impacts to existing buildings/businesses on Countryside Drive
- Improved connection to Major Mackenzie Drive (alignment) relative to what was presented as part of the SP47 TMP
- Intersection with Regional Road 50 will be constructed at-grade (typical intersection) until traffic operations indicate the need for grade separation
- Intersection with Regional Road 50 will be converted to a single point urban interchange when traffic operations warrant

Coleraine Drive


- Four lane cross-section from Arterial A2 to Mayfield Road within a 36 m rightof-way
- Widening to be done evenly either side of the existing road centerline
- Current intersection with Regional Road 50 to be disconnected and existing southern portion to be converted to a local access road with cul-de-sac, until the area is redeveloped
- Realigned at the south end to align with the intersection of Arterial A2 / East-West Arterial.

WHAT IS GTA WEST?

GTA West Study focuses on a new multimodal transportation corridor that will extend from Highway 400 in the east, to the Highway 401/407 interchange in the west, with provisions for a 400 series highway, transitway, and potential goods movement priority features. The Ministry of Transportation is currently undertaking the Stage 2 GTA West Study which will identify the route, determine interchange locations complete the preliminary design and environmental assessment. More information can be found on the project's website: www.gta-west.com

HOW DOES IT AFFECT THE SP47 ARTERIAL ROADS CLASS

Traffic studies for the arterial roads within SP47 were completed under two conditions: (1) with GTA West built by 2041, and (2) GTA West built beyond 2041. The decision was made to design the road network with flexibility to connect to the future GTA West, but under the assumption that it would not be built within the next 20 years. This is considered a 'conservative' approach, that considers worst case traffic within SP47. Alignment of A2 north of Mayfield Road is subject to final location of GTA West Interchange

WHAT ARE THE TIMELINES FOR IMPLEMENTATION OF GTA WEST?

The GTA West Stage 2 Study planning and preliminary design phase will culminate in an Environmental Assessment (EA) Report. It is anticipated that the Final EA Report will be submitted to the Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks by the end of 2022.

Following the review and approval of the EA Report, the corridor will be protected. Currently there is no commitment to a timeline for additional design and construction phase of project. The timing and duration of GTA West highway construction depends on numerous factors.





Secondary Plan Road Network

Two transportation network 'Special Policy Areas' were identified in the SP47 Transportation Master Plan as requiring additional, more detailed, evaluation as part of the Class EA process:

Special Policy Area #1 identifies potential alternative intersections of Arterial A2 with Mayfield Road. Lands within this area shall be protected from development until the intersection of Arterial A2 with Mayfield Road has been determined as part of an EA ...

"Road segments and intersections within the Special Policy Area #2 require... more in-depth functional analysis to determine network/operational solutions including intersection spacing, connectivity to the municipal and regional road network, intersection geometry and controls. It is anticipated that such in-depth assessment will be completed [as part of an EA] study for Arterial A2. Lands within Special Policy Area #2 shall be protected from development until the locations of these intersections and the arterial road alignment .. have been determined as part of the EA..."

HDR, Highway 427 Industrial Secondary Plan (Area 47) Transportation Master Plan Study, 2014., Reference Section 7.1.

The preliminary preferred configuration for arterial roadways within the Special Policy Areas has been identified through detailed analysis completed as part of the current study.



Special Policy Area 1 – Design Alternatives








Design Issues and Constraints Within Special Policy Area 2 (SPA2)

Selection of preferred road alignments and intersection details within SPA2 were deferred by the SP47 TMP as the available traffic models were unable to solve traffic issues at the proposed Regional Road 50 /Arterial A2 intersection, and the MESP Addendum had yet to be completed.


While a number of alternative designs were considered within SPA2 (see figure to the right), the detailed traffic model developed for the Class EA indicated that to keep traffic moving within this area, the intersection of Coleraine Drive and Arterial A2 would need to be moved to at least 600 m from Regional Road 50 – almost in line to with the Arterial A2/East-West Arterial intersection. To minimize impacts on planned land uses west of Arterial A2, the Coleraine Drive and East-West Arterial Intersections were then combined into a single four-way intersection.

Special Policy Area 2 – Design Alternatives (Crossing)





Single Intersection in Proximity to Rainbow Creek

Locating the single intersection between Arterial A2/Coleraine Drive/East-West Arterial a minimum of 600 m from Regional Road 50 puts it in very close proximity to the Natural Heritage System for Rainbow Creek. A series of design alternatives was developed and assessed to arrive at a preferred location and design for the Rainbow Creek crossing.

Design Alternatives

The location of the crossing is constrained by:

- Tie-ins with existing roadways (Major Mackenzie Drive, Coleraine Drive)
- Rainbow Creek and its associated Natural Heritage System (NHS)
- Commitments made with respect to the Community Park at the intersection of Clarkway Drive and East-West Arterial
- Desire to keep industrial properties between Coleraine Drive and Rainbow Creek NHS suitably sized/shaped for industrial development

Based on these constraints, two road crossing configurations were short-listed:


- Single intersection over Rainbow Creek, with the north-south axis of the intersection approximately aligned with the existing creek - Single Bridge.
- Single intersection immediately to the west of the Rainbow Creek NHS Two Bridges

Locating the intersection east of the Rainbow Creek NHS was screened out as it would result in significantly longer segments of roadway being located within the NHS.


Preferred Alternative

Detailed evaluation of alternatives indicated ecological, flood, and creek flow requirements could be achieved through both short-listed alternatives; however, the cost of providing two separate structures was significantly more. As a result, Alternative 1 was identified as the preferred alternative.

Alternatives were assessed in consultation with Toronto Regional Conservation Authority, who provided Approval In Principle for the preferred design.

Grade-Separation

Even when the intersection of Coleraine Drive and Arterial A2 is moved further west and combined with the intersection with East-West Arterial, certain movements will still experience intolerable delays by 2041. This is related both to development with SP47 and the additional traffic that will result from extension of Highway 427 to Major Mackenzie Drive. As a result, the Region of Peel will be reserving property for construction of a future interchange at the junction of Major Mackenzie Drive and Regional Road 50 by 2041.





Grade-Separation – Preferred Design


The preferred design for the grade-separation (interchange) at Regional Road 50 and Major Mackenzie Drive / Arterial A2 is a Single Point Urban Interchange (SPUI).

The Single Point Urban Interchange is the preferred option for a number of reasons:


- Construction of this alternative can be deferred to 2041, allowing the intersection to be constructed at-grade until traffic volumes increase to a level that warrants action.
- It has the lowest life cycle cost of the options considered
- Supports active transportation facilities with crossings at a signalized intersection
- Allows the transportation network to exist in a configuration that is compatible with the road network.

It is not, however, without some challenges. These include:

- Impact to properties on both the York Region and Peel Region sides of Regional Road 50 (by 2041)
- Existing accesses will need to be reconfigured.
- The intersection of Cadetta Road and Regional Road 50 will need to be relocated further to the south, requiring extension of Cadetta Road.



This is an example of Single Point Urban Interchange currently in place in the City of Ottawa that is very similar to what is being proposed as part of this project.

Coleraine Drive - Alternative Alignments





Coleraine Drive will be improved from a two-lane rural roadway with ditches, to a four-lane urban roadway with curb and gutter, storm sewers, multi-use pathways on both sides of the road, and space for transit.

Widening will require property acquisition and have potential impacts to homes, businesses, creek crossings, environmental features and species at risk habitats.

The following widening alternatives were evaluated to arrive at a preferred solution (see next panel for evaluation summary).
























Preliminary Cross Sections – East-West Arterial




Preliminary Cross Sections – Countryside Drive






Section 1: Countryside Drive: East of Arterial A2 (36.0 m ROW)




Preliminary Cross Sections – Clarkway Drive






Section 1: Clarkway Drive: Mayfield Road to Countryside Drive (36.0 m ROW)



Section 2: Clarkway Drive: Countryside Drive to East-West Arterial (30.0 m ROW)






Preliminary Cross Sections – Clarkway Drive






Section 3: Clarkway Drive: E-W Arterial to Collector Road 'C' (30.0 m ROW)

The City of Brampton (City) and Region of Peel (Region) held a meeting to provide an update on the Area 47 Project in Brampton, ON and discuss HDI's interests in future phases.

Meeting presentation was provided by email to participants on February 7, 2022 and used during the meeting.

1. INTRODUCTIONS

Wood opened the meeting and the City facilitated a round of introductions. Wood and the City thanked HDI for attending this meeting to continue the dialogue regarding the Project.

2. AGENDA (SLIDE 3)

Wood provided an overview of the agenda and explained that the meeting presentation was developed as a guide to help facilitate the discussion points throughout the meeting. Wood explained that there are a number of additional slides at the end of the presentation, which will be reviewed if specific questions are asked about the design. Wood encouraged HDI to review those slides separately and contact the Project Team (City, Region and Wood) if they have any further questions.

There were no additions to the agenda requested by HDI.

3. STUDY AREA AND STRUCTURE (SLIDE 4)

Wood explained that the study area is currently rural in nature and is expected to incur significant amount of development in the future. The Study is located in the City of Brampton and is divided in Part A and Part B roadways. Part A roads will be owned and operated by the Region of Peel and consists of Arterial A2 and Coleraine Drive. Part B roads will be owned and operated by the City of Brampton and consists of Countryside Drive, Clarkway Drive and East-West Arterial.

There were no comments or questions received from HDI on this topic.



4. ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT PROBLEM AND OPPORTUNITY STATEMENT (SLIDE 5)

Wood provided a summary of the Project's identified problems and opportunities statement s that will be addressed through the current Municipal Class Environmental Assessment Study:

- Provide enhanced inter-regional connectivity
- Provide access to proposed development
- Address anticipated traffic capacity issues resulting from extension of Highway 427 to Major Mackenzie Drive, as well as development of the study area
- Improve roadway geometrics to meet or exceed City and Regional standards
- Provide transit, pedestrian and cycling facilities
- Improve traffic, pedestrian and cyclist safety
- Improve intersection safety and operations
- Design watercourse crossings to enhance hydraulics, stream function and fisheries and wildlife passage
- Address structural deficiencies
- Improve pavement conditions
- Provide a mosaic of safe, integrated transportation choices and new modes
- Support civic sustainability, emphasizing walking, cycling, and transit.

There were no comments or questions received from HDI on this topic.

5. ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT PROCESS (SLIDE 6)

Wood summarized the Study is currently being completed as two separate Municipal Class Environmental Assessments. Phase 1 and 2 were satisfied through the City of Brampton Secondary Plan Area 47 Transportation Master Plan. The current Study includes Phase 3 and 4 and will be completed for both Part A and Part B roadways. The Study was initiated in 2015, with the first Public Information Centre (PIC) for Part A and Part B held in November 2016. The second PIC for Part A was held in November 2019 and the second PIC for Part B will be held in the coming months. Once consultation is complete, the next phase will be to prepare the Environmental Study Report.

There were no comments or questions received from HDI on this topic.

6. PROJECT TIMELINES (SLIDE 7)

Wood summarized the Studies began at the same time, however Part A progressed faster than Part B and as such, the Environmental Study Report will be available for review and comment earlier than Part B. Wood identified that there were several constraints and issues that were encountered, which resulted in significant project delays.

There were no comments or questions received from HDI on this topic.

7. COMPLETED TECHNICAL STUDIES (SLIDE 8)

Wood summarized the Stage 1 Archaeology Study identified that a Stage 2 Archaeological Assessment will be required, and this will be completed during the detailed design phase. A Built and Cultural Heritage Study identified some direct and indirect impacts are anticipated to properties and as such, a number of mitigation measures and recommendations are suggested for detailed design and construction.



There were no comments or questions received from HDI on this topic.

8. COMPLETED TECHNICAL STUDIES (SLIDE 9)

Wood summarized that the Transportation Safety Assessment identified safety concerns along the roadway and potential measures to improve safety. A Traffic Operations Study identified the need for the widening and construction of new roadways. Wood also explained that the Traffic Operations Study considers the Master Environmental Servicing Plan (MESP) and Addendum, helps guide the development of the SPA47 Secondary Plan area (bounded by Mayfield Road to the north, Castlemore Road to the south, Highway 50 to the east and the Gore Road to the west. Further information can be found here - https://www.brampton.ca/EN/Business/planning-development/policies-master-plans/Pages/Secondary-Plans-List.aspx) and creek re-alignments.

8.1 Question Wood to HDI: Wood asked HDI if they are interested in reviewing the MESP Addendum document.

HDI responded to confirm interest in reviewing this document.

As a follow up to the meeting – Wood has attached the MESP Addendum to this meeting summary.

9. COMPLETED TECHNICAL STUDIES (SLIDE 10)

Wood summarized a Fluvial Geomorphology Assessment identified watercourse crossings have been highly impacted by agricultural land practices and recommended channel realignment. The Contamination Overview Study identified several properties on or near the road that may be sources of soil and groundwater contamination and may affect construction. As a result, several recommendations are provided for consideration during detailed design and construction.

There were no comments or questions received from HDI on this topic.

10. ONGOING ANDCOMPLETED TECHNICAL STUDIES (SLIDE 10)

Wood summarized the Natural Environment Reports, specifically Terrestrial and Aquatic studies are completed and identified species at risk in the area and tributaries that have unstable flow regimes with limited canopy cover. As such, the report recommended several mitigation measures and enhancement opportunities. Wood stated the Stormwater Management Assessment is ongoing, and this report will be provided to HDI, along with the Environmental Study Report, for review and comment.

10.1 Question HDI to Wood: HDI asked if fieldwork was complete?

Wood responded that the Stormwater Management Assessment did not require fieldwork and stated that the Natural Environment Report fieldwork study activities have been completed.

11. ONGOING TECHNICAL STUDIES (SLIDE 11)

Wood summarized that the Geotechnical and Hydrogeological investigations are ongoing, and these reports will be provided for review to HDI with the Environmental Study Report. Wood also stated the Noise Study is also ongoing and preliminary results note the need for noise barriers along certain locations.



12. PART A DESIGN – REGION OF PEEL ROADWAYS (SLIDE 13 AND 14)

Wood summarized the rationale for the preliminary preferred alternative for Arterial A2 and Coleraine Drive.

12.1 Comment and Question HDI to Project Team – HDI noted that in earlier correspondence dated December 16, 2021, there was an offer for HDI to visit the study area and do a tour. HDI inquired if this was still offer was still available and if a site tour was still possible as part of the current 'ongoing' studies. (This comment was also noted to include reference to point 11 – regarding the Geotechnical and Hydrogeological investigations)

Wood responded noting that access is only available from the right-of-way, as permission to enters are required the lands beyond the right-of-way. The City noted that a site visit may be more useful during detailed design.

13. CONNECTION TO GTA WEST (SLIDE 15)

Wood summarized the Study Area intersects with the GTA West alignment corridor, and the Project Team has been consulting with MTO regularly.

There were no comments or questions received from HDI on this topic.

14. PART B DESIGN – CITY OF BRAMPTON ROADWAYS (SLIDE 16, 17 AND 18)

Wood summarized the rationale for the preliminary preferred alternative for Arterial A2 and Coleraine Drive.

There were no comments or questions received from HDI on this topic.

15. NEXT STEPS (SLIDE 19)

Wood provided an overview of the next steps in both Part A and Part B of the Studies. There will be an upcoming PIC planned for Part B in the spring of 2022, with filing of the Environmental Study Report anticipated for summer/fall 2022. Part A is anticipated to be filed by spring 2022.

The City provided an overview of the construction timeline of the roadways:

- Clarkway Drive (west) and Countryside Drive: 2024
- Clarkway Drive (east): 2026

15.1 Comment City to HDI: The City also noted that these timelines are optimistic. The Detailed Design process is anticipated to begin two years prior to construction. The City will commit to consulting with HDI during future stages and this commitment will be stated in the Environmental Study Report.

15.2 Question HDI to Project Team: HDI asked if the City is willing to compensate HDI staff for their time to review the required reports. HDI stated they have an application for this process and would provide Wood with the information.

Following the meeting, HDI provided their Application for Consideration and Engagement for Development to Wood on February 8, 2022.



The City understood the time associate with reviewing technical reports, and asked HDI for the application. The City also asked HDI if they can confirm which reports they are interested to review.

Reports:

- Environmental Study Report
- Stage 1 Archaeological Assessment
- Built and Cultural Heritage Study
- Safety Assessment
- Traffic Study
- Fluvial Geomorphology
- Contamination Overview Study
- Natural Environment Study
- Stormwater Management Study

- Hydrogeological Study
- Noise Study
- Preliminary Design (Cross-Sections, roll plans etc.)

The City also noted an earlier agreement was signed between Amec Foster Wheeler and HDI in 2017, and asked if a new agreement is required with Wood. The City noted that a new agreement is not required, however for the detailed design and construction phases, a separate agreement can be discussed at that time directly with the City and Region.

16. MEETING WRAP-UP (SLIDE 20)

Wood provided summary of the next steps to document engagement and the interest of HDI to participate in the detailed design and construction and stated that the content from the email of January 7, 2022 would also be noted – specifically that HDI would like to engage in the following:

- Minimal weekly inspection visits to observe erosion and sediment control measures
- Vegetation removal
- Work near watercourses
- Wildlife sweeps

A copy of the email from HDI with the above noted requests is attached to these meeting summary notes.

Wood identified that a meeting summary will be prepared and shared back for review and validation.

CLOSING COMMENTS:

The City, Region and Wood thanked the HDI for attending the meeting and for the discussion. HDI thanked the meeting participants as well and stated it was good that everyone could 'come together as one mind' to discuss this project.

- 1. Wood provided the MESP Report, with the meeting summary (Comment 8.1).

All that said above, I checked the project location and the Williams Treaties First Nations territory map. The project is located outside of the territory. Thus, the project falls outside the scope of our consultation requirements. The project will need to consult with the appropriate rights holders in the project area and I hope that considerations will be made with them for meaningful consultation on this project.
